A Year in the Life of a Town Mayor

...continued from last month – written by Shirley Haynes who was Chair of Thrapston Town Council 2010-2011.

Inevitably many invitations came to attend various charity events. Impossible to go to them all but several I did attend are worth a mention. In Desborough a superb buffet lunch in a lovely garden on a glorious sunny day in June was the first of these. At a coffee morning in Raunds I was surprised to find myself almost the only attendee who wasn't wearing a chain of office. I'd have felt more conspicuous as the only one who was wearing one but remembered to have mine available in future. The afternoon to raise funds for Bangladeshi flood victims at Thrapston's Tandoori Restaurant in July involved an interview for Bangladeshi Television – international fame at last.

In August we attended a Benefit Concert in Oundle for a young local boy. This was notable for the young age of the excellent musical performances. Another musical evening was Rushden's Prom in the Park, complete with picnic supper, in September. A Ferret Racing Evening in Higham Ferrers was great fun and contrasted well with one of our regular orchestral concerts in Northampton on the following evening. During the year I declined assorted charity walks, cycle rides and Civic Balls.

Events in Thrapston conveniently in walking distance were some of the most memorable of the year. We were pleased to attend the Town Band's concert to celebrate Ray Jeffery MBE's 40 years as their Musical Director. I enjoyed presenting the bicycle, bought by the Town Council, to our local Police Officers at an event at the Fire Station and coffee at the Library to support the Friends of the Library was another morning well spent. Although I'm not a gardener the Gardener's Question Time with Johnnie Amos in the Plaza was a must, as were performances of 'Noises Off' and 'Carmen' by TADS and the newly formed Thrapston Plaza Opera group. One Monday I attended the Silver Threads Luncheon Club to talk about my mayoral duties so far and to show members the chain close to.

A morning spent with Corby's mayor was another interesting event. We were taken on a tour of their magnificent new swimming pool

(Olympic standard) and gym, then toured the Cube – Library, Information Centre, Theatre and Offices – before refreshments in the impressive Mayor's Parlour.

Food was a recurring hazard throughout the year. The trouble was that it was mostly excellent. Would I still fit into any of my clothes by the year's end? Tempting refreshments after Civic Services and the occasional cream tea could have proved disastrous. One of these was at a Garden Party at Holdenby Hall. Tea will be served in the ballroom we were told. The ballroom however wasn't quite large enough and we ended up on hands and knees on the lawn juggling scone, jam, cream, cup and saucer. The superb falconry talk and display in the beautiful surroundings of the garden compensated.

A splendid meal at the Bridge Hotel by invitation of the Eastern Area Boat Station Sea Cadets was another gastronomic delight as were the two events organised by the Chairman of ENDC. A superb 'Get to Know You' dinner at Oundle Mill with some of the other East Northants Mayors was the first event and her 'Tea and Topiary' charity event at the Talbot Inn rounded off the year.

To conclude: it was an incredibly busy, exhausting and exhilarating year. I am very glad that I accepted the challenge but am also very glad it was only for one year.

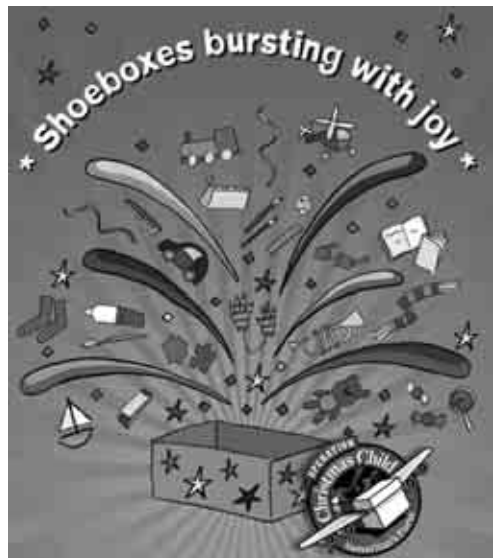

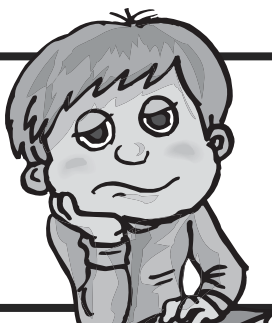

The Supermarket – at last – choice for shopping

In the 35 years I have lived in Thrapston I have watched what was a lively, bustling market town slowly die.

From having a good variety of shops where it was possible to do a good proportion of the family shopping, we now have very restricted parking and less and less choice for shopping. Is it any wonder that many people choose to shop elsewhere? A great number of people I have spoken to are very keen to see another supermarket open (giving us a choice of where we shop) and to have the convenience of a good town car park which they can use when they wish to conduct any business in the High Street.

Like myself, others have expressed concern about the traffic problems which need to be solved. I do not believe these difficulties are insurmountable and understand that Sainsbury's and ENDC are working closely with the Highways Department in order to resolve them.

With a further 500 dwellings to be built on land at the top of Market Road we urgently need to improve ALL the town facilities if it is to be a place where people wish to live. With an aging population we should also be considering making things more convenient for those who are dependent on shopping locally.

Our Town Council has chosen not to support

this planning application which makes me wonder just how much they are in touch with the majority of Thrapston residents. If YOU support this planning application then please raise your voice and make your opinion known to ENDC Planning Department, Cedar Drive, Thrapston. Let's breathe some life into the town!

In October's issue we saw an article from Richard Swindall the anti Sainsbury lobbyist. So far the anti group have had much to say against the idea of a Sainsbury supermarket being brought into the town. Progress will always have a downside but I am for the Sainsbury's. All those people who currently are against the idea of a Sainsbury's should consider the positives as well as the negatives involved. It will smarten up the area where the current cattlemarket is showing its age. It will bring employment into a town that has teenagers who are unemployed. It will alleviate pavement parking which is a current complaint made by the residents on Market Road. Those people already supporting the local shops will surely continue to do so, however one must ask the question how many people drive out of Thrapston to shop? Mr Swindall comments regarding Thrapston as being a pleasant 'Market Town' when he moved here how long ago was that? as quite frankly the town is very tired looking and needs re-generating big time. Yes a Sainsbury's will entice people from surrounding areas to visit but this can only bring recognition to the local shops and facilities. The reality is that to compete in today's world you need to be pro-active on all fronts. Incidentally I was informed that the number of inhabitants is closer to 10,000 and that a further 500 homes are being planned on the Huntingdon Road end of Market Road.

Lucy's Rainbow, A Journey Of Hope



As a child I sometimes accompanied my mother to churches in and around

Wellingborough when her beautiful soprano voice warmed many hearts. She sang in Wellingborough and Rushden Operatic and I particularly loved her role as Eliza Doolittle, with Keith Tompkins, at the Lyric. In fact, I was even called 'Judy' after her leading role in 'Love from Judy'. As a teenager I enjoyed helping at my dad's shop, Huckle's, on a Saturday and in the holidays. I would amble down the high street half-way through the morning, more concerned with my outfit than the seriousness of business. There was always something to laugh about, be it the barley wine on Christmas Eve or the unsigned cheque I blindly filed. I was a member of All Hallows Church, enjoying Sunday school, brownies, guides and youth club.

For years I had longed to meet my Mr Right, and eventually I did, and married in '93. It was June 2007 - 7 years had passed: we had two little girls and life was good. Then, it happened. Within 4 months from diagnosis, my husband died, and I was a widow and single parent. Life as I knew it had changed. Throughout the last 11 years God has helped me to do what I thought I never could - to get through the grief of losing my husband and to bring up my two daughters alone.

I have been recording my story for several years and it has recently been published as 'Lucy's Rainbow' - A Journey of Hope.
